Horsetown-Clear Creek Preserve Wins National Award

Horsetown-Clear Creek Preserve is a local gem near the community of Igo. It consists of 27 acres located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Clear Creek Road and Clear Creek and has been set aside for low impact, nature related recreation and education. You are welcome to walk on the hiking trails, stroll along the creek, and have a picnic at the amphitheater. In the spring and fall months hikes and interpretive events are organized for the public to enjoy at no cost, which include education about nature such as birds, wildflowers, native plants, salmon, and acorns.

Our group recently received one of seven national "Making a Difference" awards from the Bureau of Land Management for the work we do in the Lower Clear Creek Greenway. Our educational events occur on the Preserve and on BLM lands upstream and downstream where we strive to build stewardship for the environment, the fishery and the wildlife. Our amphitheater provides an outdoor classroom for field trips of all ages.

Horsetown-Clear Creek Preserve, Inc. is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization, managed by a volunteer board of directors and supported by tax-deductible donations from the public. Volunteers maintain trails, build benches, pick up trash and keep the toilet clean and supplied. Take your family and friends to enjoy some quality outdoor time together.
