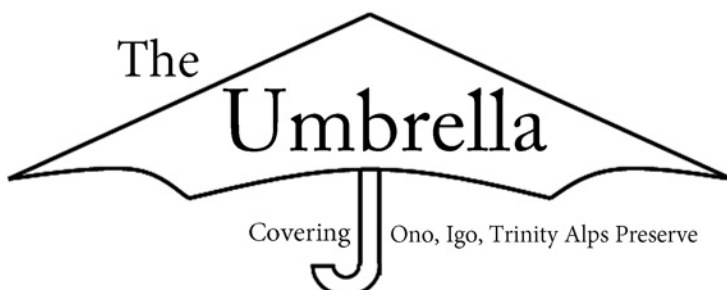



Mark your calendars for this **free** event!

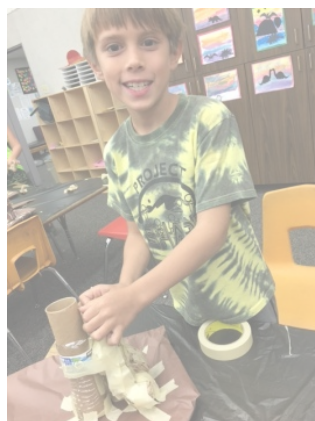
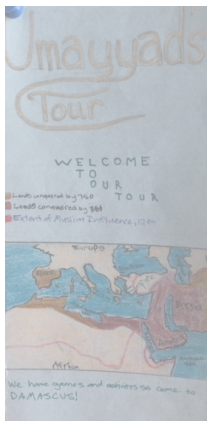
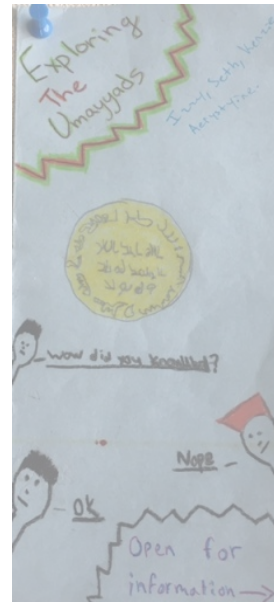
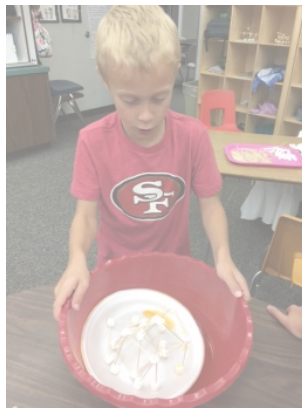
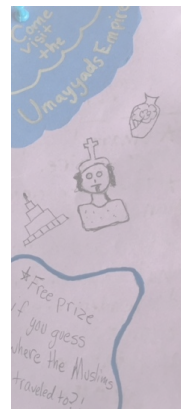
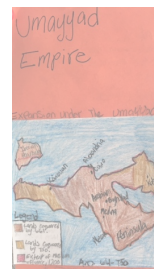
We will be looking for donations of food, monetary, or gift cards to help us put on a Traditional Christmas Dinner for the entire community!
